# First 5 San Bernardino

promotes, supports and enhances the health and early development of children prenatal through age five and their families and communities through organizations who provides those services.

The Commission receives funds from the 1998 Proposition 10 tobacco initiative. In 2009-2010 the Commission allocated \$26.7 million to fund 74 San Bernardino County service organizations.





**36,570 children and 62, 785 parents**  
were served through First 5 San Bernardino

# Health & Well-Being

**2,792** children received a Well-Child Check Up

**16,434** children received oral health screenings which resulted in **3,897** children receiving dental treatment

**8,858** parents received health education sessions including CPR, Home Safety, and Nutrition & Fitness

**1,350** children received treatment through the SART (Screenings, Assessment, Referral, & Treatment) Program

**3,391** children received Health Insurance Assistance services

**30,000** families received tips and referrals for water safety



# Early Care & Education

**1,716** children participated in School Readiness programs supporting early literacy, language development and encouraging parent involvement in their child's learning

**10,000** new books were given to children through community events, schools and partner programs

**25,000** parents and caregivers were given literacy resources such as reading tips and developmental milestones tied to literacy

**1,650** professionals have received early care and education training which has contributed to higher quality and education to our children



**First 5 San Bernardino funds**

**615** specialized positions at hospitals, school districts, nonprofits and community-based organizations in the County

A total of **74** service organizations received Commission funding for direct services



## Family Support

**8,015** parents received parent education services including intensive parent support, home visitation and support groups to increase parent skills and improved family functioning

**12,291** parents received referrals to assist with basic needs and family support

**5,026** case management services were provided for families at risk for homelessness




# Funding
